An Environmental Maintenance Bond isn't typically required for a dredging project such as this. Is there a specific reason that a maintenance bond is required for this bid, or can it be removed? Our bonding company needs a better understanding of the purpose of the bond.

Answer: The Environmental Maintenance Bond is a specific requirement of the funding source for the project, The New Jersey Infrastructure Bank. The Environmental Maintenance Bond will be required to be presented to the Authority at project completion.


Information for Bid, Section II-Bid Information,
