ADDENDUM NO. 2

This Addendum has been prepared to respond to questions posed by potential bidders on the above-referenced project. The questions and answers are provided as follows:

Question 1. The bid form specifies EPA 200.8 for copper analysis in sediment. If we meet the RL requirement of 1.5 mg/Kg with EPA 6010 (we currently have an RL of 1.25 mg/Kg), can we use this method as 200.8 is not a viable method for sediment.?

Answer 1. *The Authority accepts EPA method 6010 as an alternative to EPA 200.8 for sediment testing.*
