

**PROPOSAL**

**REHABILITATION OF THE LANDING LANE SPILLWAY  
AT STATION 2999+50  
OF THE DELAWARE & RARITAN CANAL  
CITY OF NEW BRUNSWICK, MIDDLESEX COUNTY, NJ  
WSA B21023**

Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received at the NJ Water Supply Authority, P.O. Box 5196, 1851 Route 31, Clinton, New Jersey 08809 until 10:00 a.m., **May 6, 2021**, and will be publicly opened and read immediately thereafter, subject to Executive Order 107 and the COVID-19 crisis that remains in effect.

The Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment required for the complete and full implementation of the proposed construction for the rehabilitation of the Landing Lane Spillway on the Delaware & Raritan Canal in the City of New Brunswick, Middlesex County, New Jersey ('Project') generally consisting of, but not limited to, the following:

- Site clearing;
- Soil erosion and sediment control;
- Control of water;
- Installation of historic timbers;
- Dismantling of a historic stone spillway;
- Subgrade preparation;
- Placement of fill;
- Placement of reinforced concrete;
- Reconstruction of a historic stone spillway;
- Installation of gabions;
- Installation of riprap;
- Site restoration including cleanup, top soiling, fertilizing and seeding;
- Reconstruction of the multi-use trail

Prospective bidders should familiarize themselves with the Delaware and Raritan Canal Elevation in the vicinity of the spillway. Current and historic Canal elevations at Landing Lane bridge can be monitored online at the following link:

<http://www.njwsa.org/procurement.html> . The Authority will not be responsible for full or partial sets of Bidding Documents, including any Addenda, obtained from any other source.

The Contractor will be required to Substantially Complete all work within 180 calendar days from Notice to Proceed, and offer for Final Acceptance the entire project within 210 calendar days from Notice to Proceed.

All bids submitted shall be accompanied by a bid security amounting to not less than 10% percent of the total bid price or \$20,000, whichever is less. Such security shall be in the form of a certified check or bid bond, payable or firmly bound to the New Jersey Water Supply Authority. Any bond submitted shall be posted by a recognized surety company licensed to do business in the State of New Jersey and listed in Department Circular 570, 2009 Revision, of the U.S. Department of the Treasury, incorporated herein by reference. A certified copy of the agent's authority to act must accompany all bid bonds signed by an agent. If a contract is awarded, the successful bidder shall enter into contract and shall furnish a Performance Bond and Payment Bond equal to 100% of the bid amount submitted.

A goal of 25% of the value of the contract shall be established for the award of contracts to New Jersey based, Division of Revenue-Small Businesses Enterprise Unit registered small businesses in accordance with the provisions of N.J.A.C. 17:13-4.1; Executive Order 71.

Bidders are required to comply with the provisions of the State of New Jersey Business Registration Certification Act (N.J.S.A. 52:32-44), Affirmative Action Compliance requirements (N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 17:27), the Diane B. Allen Equal Pay Act (N.J.S.A. 34:11-56.14), the Small Business Set Aside Act (N.J.S.A. 52:32-17 et seq.), Pay to Play Prohibitions and Political Contribution Disclosure requirements (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 et seq. (P.L. 2005, c.51), N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.27 (P.L. 2005, c.271)).
